Tips to learn the charts (These will really help rhythm instruments as well!)

- Learn the "Head" (the melody) of the chosen song
- Find recordings of professionals playing the chosen song
- Learn for each chord: (Use the circle of 4ths or the aebersold handbook! Take notes!)
 - Learn the scale (Up and Down)
 - 3rd and 7th or each chord (In one octave then different octaves)
 - Arpeggio (Do some reps going up the arpeggio and some going down.)
 - Penta-Scale (first five notes up or down)
 - Pentatonic Scale
 - Major Chord (ex. Fmaj7) 1-2-3-5-6
 - Minor Scale (ex. F-7) 1-3-4-5-7
 - Dominant Chord (ex. F7) 1-2-3-5-6 (or minor pentatonic starting on the 6th)
- Find out which chords have the same "Key Signature" in common
- Think of Melodies or creative ideas using the new found roadmap that the chords provided for you!
 - Remember to think about: Theme or subject matter of song, Dynamics in Solo,
 Rhythmic Theme or your solo, using space in your solo
